

## WHAT is Pneumococcal Meningitis?

Meningitis is an infection. The infection is in the fluid that surrounds the brain. There are two main types of meningitis, viral and bacterial. Pneumococcal meningitis is a type of bacterial meningitis that has been reported in people with cochlear implants. This can be a serious infection. Prevention with immunizations is strongly recommended; treatment can be effective when detected early.

## WHAT kind of vaccinations do I need?

In addition to the recommended immunizations children routinely receive, the CDC also recommends pneumococcal vaccinations, the “Pneumo Shot”, for people with cochlear implants.

## WHEN should I get vaccinated?

Every person getting a cochlear implant should be vaccinated prior to surgery. If you already have a cochlear implant and have not been vaccinated, get vaccinated now.
